Project Description

Nature Detectives will search from a selection of four different locations - one for each week of the project. Their search sites may include a community garden or their home garden, a park site and other sites of their choice where ladybugs are likely to be found. Children submit evidence via an online form on the Lost Ladybug Project website.

Come as often as you can - Not required to attend all 4 weeks.
Research begins Saturday, March 13.

Discover the Evidence

- find ladybugs,
- identify their species
- location, time, date
- number found

Document Findings

- Record evidence in Nature Detectives Discovery Journals - Draw a picture of ladybugs found (create journals at event)
- Take photographs and complete online submission forms.
